Will you go, if the Lord sends you? In an effort to help our brothers and sisters get involved in missions, the Outreach Department has made contact with missionaries in various parts of the world to understand how the Lord can use us. Read the brief descriptions below and pray over them. If God moves you to participate in any of the ministries, let us know, so we can help get you equipped for service!

Where?	What?
East Asia	God can use us to strengthen our brothers and sisters in this part of East Asia through the teaching of the Bible. We can regularly send workers who have a heart to teach intensive, one-week Bible lessons to members of the local church here. Brothers and sisters who volunteer should have the gift of teaching.
East Asia	We have made contact with a Christian-run organization founded to take care of orphans and children with special needs. It seeks to transform the lives of children by turning abandonment and despair into love and hope. Other than sponsoring the children under the care of this organization, we can also send teams on one to two-week visits to the orphanage to build meaningful relationships with the children and to help out with other mission-related projects.
Middle East	The Southern Baptist Convention has been involved in mission work in the Kurdish areas of Eastern Turkey for over three years now. The goal is to distribute Bibles and the Jesus film to people we meet. Through prayer walks and scripture distributions, missionaries have seen and heard of Muslims being saved and churches being started in this part of the world. Pastor Norm Howell, who visited our church last year during the Global Impact Celebration, is in charge of this ministry. He will personally come to our church to train brothers and sisters willing to go.
North America	We have started contacting workers in New Mexico and North Dakota, asking about how we can help out in reaching out to Native Americans in these areas with the gospel. We will provide the congregation with more information as soon as we receive it.
